

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Awareness session on Google classroom

Google Classroom integrates a variety of other Google Applications for Education, such as Google Docs, Google Sheets, Google Slides, Gmail, and Google Calendar into a cohesive platform to manage student and teacher communication. Students can be invited to join a class through a private "class code" or be imported automatically from a school domain. Teachers can create, distribute and mark assignments all within the Google domain. Each class creates a separate folder in the respective user's Google Drive, where the student can submit work to be graded by a teacher. Assignments and due dates are added to Google Calendar, where each assignment can belong to a category or topic. Teachers can monitor each student's progress by reviewing revision history of a document, and after being graded, teachers can return work along with comments and grades. I am sure you have frequently encountered the words like, e-government, e-health, e-shopping, e-business, e-commerce, e-books, e-libraries, e-learning and so on. Almost everything today has gone electronic, while a few years ago World Wide Web was considered a Privilege, today it is a necessity. Everyone can use and learn from electronic devices. ICT today has the power to transform Education.

GOOGLE CLASS ROOM CONCEPT AND CHARACTERISTICS

Google Classroom integrates several Google Applications for Education (GAPPS) such as Google Drive, Google Docs, Google Sheets, Google Slides, Google



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Forms, Google Sites, Gmail to help educational institutions transition to a virtual, paperless system. Google Calendar was later added to help with assignment due dates, field trips, and class speakers. Students can be invited to classrooms through the institution's database, through a private code that can then be added in the student's user interface or automatically imported from a school domain. Each class created with Google Classroom creates a separate folder in the respective user's Google Drive, where the student can submit work to be graded by a teacher

Assignments

Assignments are stored and graded on Google's suite of productivity applications that allow collaboration between the teacher and the student or between students. Instead of sharing documents that reside on the student's Google Drive with the teacher, files are hosted on the student's Drive and then submitted for grading. Teachers on Google Classroom have the option of creating Assignments in various templates and formats with different accessibility options: "student can view file," "student can edit file," or "make a copy for each student". These assignments can be submitted for a grade and teacher feedback. Students can also choose to attach additional documents from their Drive to the assignment. Set assignments appear on the 'To do' list.

Grading

Google Classroom supports many different grading schemes. Teachers have the option to attach files to the assignment which students can view, edit, or get an individual copy. Students can create files and then attach them to the assignment if a copy of a file wasn't created by the teacher. Teachers have the option to monitor the progress of each student on the assignment where they can make comments and edit. Turned in assignments can be graded by the teacher and returned with comments to allow the student to revise the assignment and turn back in. Once turned in, assignments can only be edited by the teacher unless the teacher turns the assignment back.



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Communication

Announcements can be posted by teachers to the class stream which can be commented on by students allowing for two-way communication between the teacher and students. Students can also post to the class stream but won't be as high a priority as an announcement by a teacher and can be moderated. Multiple types of media from Google products such as YouTube videos and Google Drive files can be attached to announcements and posts to share content. Gmail also provides email options for teachers to send emails to one or more students in the Google Classroom interface. Classroom can be accessed on the web or via the Android and iOS Classroom mobile apps.

Originality Report

Originality report was introduced in January 2020. It allows educators and students to see the parts and sections of the submitted work which contains the exact or similar wording to that of another source. For students, it highlights source materials and flags missing citation to assist the student in improving their writing. Teachers can also view the originality report, allowing them to verify the academic integrity of the student's submitted work. On G Suite for Education (free), teachers can turn on originality report for 3 assignments but have limited cloud storage. This restriction is lifted on G Suite Enterprise for Education (paid).

Archive Courses

Classroom allows instructors to archive courses at the end of a term or year. When a course is archived, it is removed from the homepage and placed in the Archived Classes area to help teachers keep their current classes organized. When a course is archived, teachers and students can view it, but won't be able to make any changes to it until it is restored.

Mobile Applications

Google Classroom mobile apps, introduced in January 2015, are available for iOS and Android devices. The applications let users take photos and attach them to their assignments, share files from other apps, and support offline access, easing accessibility for users.



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eLearning Industry tested and made a review of Google Classroom, in which they highlighted many positive and negative aspects. Among Classroom's strengths, the review highlighted ease of use, universal device accessibility, use of Google Drive as an effective way for teachers to quickly share assignments with students, the paperless process meaning the end of printing, handing out, and potentially losing work, and the fast feedback system between students and teachers. Among Classroom's disadvantages, the review highlighted the service's heavy integration of Google apps and services with limited or no support for external files or services, lack of automated quizzes and tests, and a lack of live chats that can aid in feedback efforts. Google Classroom won a 2020 Webby Special Achievement Award.

Due to the prominence of Google, students find Google Classroom easy to navigate since many are familiar with Google layout. Furthermore, the mobile app for Google Classroom functions well which has been praised by students. If notifications are enabled, the mobile app for Google Classroom can provide push notifications to remind students of upcoming deadlines, a feature that has been received well by students.

Additional research has shown the benefits of using Google Classroom in a blended learning model such as developing self-efficacy skills and attaining learning outcomes.

C. After having formal discussions on the subject, both the parties have decided to enter into an agreement, which they are executing this agreement. That, the terms and conditions with respect to the agreement are drafted after mutual consent and duly singed by the representatives.

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TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF AGREEMENT

OBJECTIVES:

- Training to be provided by experienced and efficient trainers, which will be useful for the students of DIET (DADI INSTITUTE of ENGINEERING and TECHNOLOGY) for the purpose of career placements' related selection procedure.
- II. Trainers to take the initiative for the active participation of students, which the sessions to be productive and the training to be flexible to reach the standards of basic level of understanding.
- III. Campus Recruitment Training, as the name suggests, should be relevant to the present employability skills of the job market, which will be useful to the final year students of B.Tech, at the time of companies' selection process.
- IV. After the completion of the training program, trainers to evaluate the program outcome, by the way of conducting written tests, mock interviews and the selection process relevant to the respective branch of B.Tech.

CURRICULUM/ DURATION/DISCIPLINE:

- V. That, COIGN CONSULTANTS agrees to impart training based on the curriculum discussed and given by DIET, also relevant content if any, suitable for the training program will be added at any stage of the training process with mutual consent the parties.
- VI. That, the strength of the students in a section will be 60 and each section will be allocated with one trainer. In any case, to increase the strength of a section/class room, the COIGN CONSULTANTS will have to go forward only with consultation of Department of Training and Placements of the DIET.

VII. The COIGN CONSULTANTS will allocate trainers according to the requirement - 120 hours per section of students, which is spread across 40 days duration. - That, the right to evaluate/break the agreement at any and every stage and XIV. decision making right on continuity of the training program vests/lies with the DIET only.

PAYMENT CONDITIONS:

- XV. The DIET shall pay according to the intervals given below to the COIGN CONSULTATINTS: 25% of the mutually agreed fee at the time of commencement of the training

LISTENING SKILLS

Introduction: Listening is the act of hearing attentively. Research shows that 45% of our time is spent on listening. We listen more than speak. If this listening skill is used in a proper way we can master the tools of communicative skills. Listening is difficult, as human mind tends to distract easily. A person who controls his mind and listens attentively acquires various other skills and is benefited.

Objectives:

- Understanding listening skills
- Practicing Phonetics
- Improving Communication skills

Importance of Listening Skills

: Listening skill makes you successful in workplace, family and in the society. Good listening skill is mandatory to get into a profession in communications, management, planning, sales, etc. Listening skills involve a different set of etiquettes, questioning for explanation, showing empathy and providing a suitable response.

LISTENING PROCESS

: There are six stages in listening process - hearing, attending, understanding, remembering, evaluating, and responding. These stages occur in sequence, but they generally performed with little awareness an often rapid succession

- Hearing it refers to the response caused by sound waves stimulating the sensory receptors of the ear; it is physical response; hearing is perception of sound waves; you must hear to listen, but you need not listen to hear.
- Attention- brain screens stimuli and permits only a select few to come into focus- these selective perception is known as attention, an important requirement for effective listening; strong stimuli like bright lights, sudden noise...are attention getters.
- Understanding- to understand symbols we have seen and heard, we must analyse the meaning of the stimuli we have perceived; symbolic stimuli are not only words but also sounds like applause... and



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sights like blue uniform...that have symbolic meanings as well; the meanings attached to these symbols are a function of our past associations and of the context in which the symbols occur; for successful interpersonal communication, the listener must understand the intended meaning and the context assumed by the sender.

- Remembering- it is important listening process because it means that an individual has not only received and interpreted a message but has also added it to the mind's storage bank; but just as our attention is selective, so too is our memory- what is remembered may be quite different from what was originally seen or heard.
- Evaluating- it is a stage in which active listeners participate; it is at these point that the active listener weighs evidence, sorts fact from opinion, and determines the presence or absence of bias or prejudice in a message;
- Responding- this stage requires that the receiver complete the process through verbal and/or nonverbal feedback; because the speaker has no other way to determine if a message has been received, this stage becomes the only overt means by which the sender may determine the degree of success in transmitting the message.

Types of Listening:

- > Whole-person listening-understanding the speaker, his words, thought, motive etc.
- > Appreciative Listening- Listening for appreciation and pleasure.
- > Attentive Listening -attentively listening each and every word.
- > Casual Listening- Listening not very attentive, listening casually without any interest.
- Evaluative Listening- Listening to evaluate or judge something.
- Selective listening: We all listen selectively at some time or other.
- Talking speed vs. speed of thought: There is a considerable difference between the speed at which people talk and the speed at which they think.
- Lack of interest: This could be due to lack of interest in the individual speaking or being distracted by things that are happening to you personally.
- Beliefs and attitudes: we all have opinions on a variety of current issues; we feel strongly about certain subjects; we value certain behaviours.
- Preconceptions: Our preconceptions often mean we don't even give another person a chance to speak. We can prejudge what they have to say.



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- Have eye contact with the speaker.
- Sit straight and adapt a posture to tell the speaker that you are listening.
- Show some gesture which represents attentive learning, for example nodding of the head.
- Verbal responses while listening shows that you are a good listener.
- ✓ Wait for the speaker to complete his speech and then share your views, don't interrupt him.
- Try to concentrate on the complete speech.
- Do not give your views unless you are asked to do so.

PHONETICS:

Phonetics is the scientific study of speech sounds. It is a fundamental branch of Linguistics. Received Pronunciation (RP) is a form of pronunciation of the English language which has traditionally been the prestige British accent. RP is a form of English. The Sounds of English and Their Representation: In English, there is no one-to-one relation between the system of writing and the system of pronunciation. The alphabet which we use to write English has 26 letters but in English there are approximately 44 speech sounds. To represent the basic sound of spoken languages linguists use a set of phonetic symbols called the International Phonetic Alphabet (IPA). Consonants are 24 in numbers. And there are twenty distinctive vowel sounds, made up of twelve pure vowels or monophthongs and eight vowel diphthongs (glides).

Classification of Sounds in English

The English alphabet has 26 letters out of which 5 are vowels and the rest are consonants. These letters and letter combinations give rise to 44 sounds. These 44 sounds are divided into 20 vowel sounds (i.e., 12 pure vowels and 8 diphthongs) and 24 consonants. They are as follows:

Vowels

Vowels are the sounds in the production of which there is no obstruction of air. They are produced with the vibration of vocal cords and the air passes freely through the mouth. All vowels are voiced sounds.

There are altogether 20 vowel sounds, out of which 12 are pure vowels and 8 are diphthongs.

Consonants

Consonants are the sounds in the production of which there is obstruction of air. They are not produced with the vibration of vocal cords and the air doesn't move freely through the mouth. In the words of Christopherson a consonant may be defined as a sound in which the movement of air from the lungs is obstructed a result of a narrowing or a complete closure of the air passage. Consonants include all breathed sounds, certain voiced sounds, accompanied by a frictional noise and certain sounds which are gliding.

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READING COMPREHENSION

Objectives

To understand the interaction between the words that are written and how they trigger knowledge.

Description

Effective communication skills are always essential in our academic as well as professional career. They are more vital these days amidst the phenomenal advancement in technology globalization, increasing cultural diversity. Among the four basic skills, reading skill is an important communicative process and reading skills are probably the most important language skills required for academic and professional purposes.

What is reading comprehension?

The purpose of reading is to connect the ideas on the page to what we already know. Reading comprehension refers to the ability to understand information presented in written form.

Techniques for good comprehension

- Skimming (quick reading)
- ✓ Scanning (looking for specific information)
- Non-verbal signals (fonts, bold print heading, figures etc.)
- Structure of the text (introduction, body conclusion etc)
- Structure of paragraphs (topic sentence, develop the aspect summary etc)
- Punctuation
- ✓ Author's viewpoints
- Reading anticipation: determining the meaning of words
- Summarizing.

Reading methods

Two reading methods that can be used effectively for reading scientific and technical texts are

ERRQ and SQ3R techniques.

ERRQ reading technique has four stages, i.e. Estimate, Read, Respond, and Question. The basic purpose of this strategy is to get the reader to link what he/she has with new information. This technique might be useful for reading any kind of text.



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SQ3R ensures high degree of understanding and remembrance. It has five stages, i.e., Survey, Question, Read, Recall, and Revise.

Reading comprehension is phenomenal and crucial in assessing language skills in various entrance examinations.

Conclusion: The students will get the ability to recognize words quickly and effortlessly. Over time, the students gain more and more responsibility for using the strategies until they can use them independently.

Example

Horse owners who plan to breed one or more mares should have a working knowledge of heredity and know how to care for breeding animals and foals. The number of mares bred that actually conceive varies from about 40 to 85 percent, with the average running less than 50 percent. Some mares that do conceive fail to produce living foals. This means that, on average, two mares are kept a whole year to produce one foal, and even then, some foals are disappointments from the standpoint of quality. By careful selection, breeders throughout history have developed various kinds of horses with a wide variety of characteristics to suit many different needs. The Great Horse of the Middle Ages, for example, was bred for size and strength to carry a heavily armoured knight. The massive horses of such breeds are often called "cold blooded." The Arabs bred lithe desert horses that were small and swift. These animals are often referred to as "hot blooded." Cross-breeding of hot blooded and cold-blooded horses for certain characteristics produced breeds ranging from riding horses to draft horses. The Thoroughbred is considered by many to be the highpoint of elegance and fine selective breeding. Many persons mistakenly apply the name Thoroughbred to any purebred horse. But a Thoroughbred is a distinct breed of running horses that traces its ancestry through the male line directly back to three Eastern stallions: the Byerly Turk, the Darley Arabian, and the Godolphin Barb. For convenience the breeds of horses are often divided into three major groups: (1) ponies, (2) heavy, or draft horses, and (3) light horses.
