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ANTI- RAGGING COMPLAINT

These points relate to the official bodies and documents required by regulatory authorities.

1. **Constitution of Anti-Ragging Committee:** Establish an official committee headed by the Head of the Institution, including faculty, parents, senior/fresher students, police/civil administration representatives, and media representatives.
 2. **Constitution of Anti-Ragging Squad:** Form a smaller, active body of faculty/non-teaching staff for vigilance, surveillance, and surprise checks, especially in vulnerable areas.
 3. **Establishment of an Anti-Ragging Cell:** Set up a centralized functional cell for monitoring compliance and receiving complaints.
 4. **Mandatory Student Affidavit:** Ensure every student submits an **online Anti-Ragging Undertaking/Affidavit** annually via the National Anti-Ragging Portal.
 5. **Mandatory Parent/Guardian Affidavit:** Ensure every parent/guardian submits a corresponding online Anti-Ragging Undertaking/Affidavit annually.
 6. **Inclusion in Prospectus:** Explicitly state the complete prohibition of ragging and the resulting exemplary punishments in the admission advertisement, prospectus, and information booklets.
 7. **Online Compliance Submission:** Submit the institution's anti-ragging compliance report annually to the AICTE/UGC monitoring agency.
 8. **Strict Adherence to Penal Laws:** Ensure all ragging incidents are immediately reported to the police/local authorities to register a First Information Report (FIR).
 9. **Punishment Protocol:** Define and enforce a clear, non-negotiable protocol for imposing exemplary and varied punishments (e.g., rustication, expulsion, fine) on those found guilty.
 10. **Impact on Accreditation:** Acknowledge that non-compliance or serious ragging incidents will adversely affect the institution's accreditation, ranking, and grading.
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
□ **Awareness and Dissemination Measures**

These points focus on educating the community about the policy and consequences.

11. **Display of Posters/Banners:** Prominently display large, multi-colored **Anti-Ragging posters** (preferably 8x6 feet) at all vulnerable and conspicuous places (hostels, mess, canteen, library, departments, etc.).



12. **Information Booklet for Freshers:** Distribute a printed leaflet/booklet to all freshers detailing all anti-ragging contacts (wardens, committee members, police, etc.) and what constitutes ragging.
13. **Website Visibility:** Ensure the college website prominently displays the names, complete address, and 24x7 contact details (phone, email) of all Anti-Ragging Committee/Squad members and Nodal Officers.
14. **Publicity through Media:** Utilize local media (print, social, audiovisual) to publicize the law prohibiting ragging and the institution's commitment to a ragging-free campus.



15. **Induction and Orientation Programs:** Conduct mandatory, comprehensive anti-ragging orientation/induction programs for all freshers and seniors at the start of the academic session.

□ Monitoring and Preventive Actions

These actions focus on physical and active steps to prevent and detect ragging.

16. **Staff Mentoring Groups:** Divide freshers into **small groups**, each assigned to a dedicated faculty member/staff mentor who interacts with them daily to monitor their well-being.
17. **Separate Hostel Accommodation:** Arrange for **separate hostel blocks or floors** for freshers, ensuring zero access for senior students.
18. **Residential Vigilance:** Conduct **surprise inspections** of hostels, students' accommodations, canteens, bus stops, and all potential ragging spots, particularly during the initial months.
19. **Installation of CCTV Cameras:** Install and maintain functional **CCTV cameras** at all vital and vulnerable points, including entrances, corridors, canteens, and common areas.
20. **Proctorial Board/Faculty Presence:** Deploy senior faculty and the Anti-Ragging Squad at strategic locations during crucial times, such as breaks, lunch, and entry/exit times.
21. **Differing Timetables:** Maintain **different class and break timings** for freshers and senior students, especially during the first few weeks, to minimize unsupervised contact.
22. **Bus Supervision:** Assign faculty members or specific staff to commute in college buses used by students to prevent ragging during transit.
23. **Security Tightening:** Enhance general security and lighting, especially at night and in isolated spots.



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
